- L: Brothers and sisters in Christ, today we hear from Jesus the greatest of commandments: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength." The second is this: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Recognizing our failure to keep these commandments, let us confess our sin and plead to God for help.
