# The Lord's Supper

Though we are eager for all to participate fully in the Lord's Supper, we do not want to compromise any portion of God's Word among us. Because Scripture states that the Lord's Supper can be taken to one's spiritual harm if not properly understood, we ask all visitors to refer to the following statement of belief regarding the Lord's Supper before communing:

I am truly sorry for the sin in my life. I am struggling to die to my sin and to live in faith in Jesus. I am looking to Jesus to empower me to stop my sinning and to live a new life in Him. I believe when I receive the bread, I am receiving the true body of Christ, and when I receive the wine, I am receiving the true blood of Jesus. I believe that when I receive His true body and blood my sins are forgiven, I am given power over sin, death and the devil, and the gift of eternal life. My faith is completely in the words of Jesus.

The Lord's Supper offers the two-fold gift of forgiveness and peace with God on the one hand, and unity and oneness among those who commune together on the other hand (Matt. 26:28; 1 Cor. 10:16–17). Those who receive the body and the blood of the Lord do so in terms of their relationship with God as well as with their fellow-communicants. Therefore, all baptized believers who understand and agree with the above Lutheran teaching of the Lord's Supper are welcome to attend. As always, we encourage you to speak with Pastor Ray or Pastor Aaron with any questions or concerns. Thank you.

### **CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION**

L: Our help is in the name of the LORD,

C: who made heaven and earth.

L: I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,"

C: and You forgave the iniquity of my sin.

C: Almighty God, our maker and redeemer, we confess unto You that we are by nature sinful and unclean and that we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed. ### LISTENING TO GOD SPEAK TO US THROUGH HIS WORD

Ezekiel 2:1-5

<sup>1</sup>"Stand up, son of man," said the voice. "I want to speak with you." <sup>2</sup>The Spirit came into me as he spoke, and he set me on my feet. I listened carefully to his words. <sup>3</sup> "Son of man," he said, "I am sending you to the nation of Israel, a rebellious nation that has rebelled against me. They and their ancestors have been rebelling against me to this very day. <sup>4</sup>They are a stubborn and hard-hearted people. But I am sending you to say to them, 'This is what the Sovereign LORD says!' <sup>5</sup> And whether they listen or refuse to listen—for remember, they are rebels—at least they will know they have had a prophet among them. (NLT)

## **NEW TESTAMENT**

2 Corinthians 12:1-10

<sup>1</sup> This boasting will do no good, but I must go on. I will reluctantly tell about visions and revelations from the Lord. <sup>2</sup>I was caught up to the third heaven fourteen years ago. Whether I was in my body or out of my body, I don't know—only God knows. <sup>3</sup> Yes, only God knows whether I was in my body or outside my body. But I do know <sup>4</sup> that I was caught up to paradise and heard things so astounding that they cannot be expressed in words, things no human is allowed to tell. <sup>5</sup> That experience is worth boasting about, but I'm not going to do it. I will boast only about my weaknesses. <sup>6</sup> If I wanted to boast, I would be no fool in doing so, because I would be telling the truth. But I won't do it, because I don't want anyone to give me credit beyond what they can see in my life or hear in my message, <sup>7</sup> even

though I have received such wonderful revelations from God. So to keep me from becoming proud, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger from Satan to torment me and keep me from becoming proud. <sup>8</sup> Three different times I begged the Lord to take it away. <sup>9</sup> Each time he said, "My grace is all you need. My power works best in weakness." So now I am glad to boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ can work through me. <sup>10</sup> That's why I take pleasure in my weaknesses, and in the insults, hardships, persecutions, and troubles that I suffer for Christ. For when I am weak, then I am strong. (NLT)

### **COMMON ALLELUIA AND VERSE**

HOLY GOSPEL Mark 6:1-13

L: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the sixth chapter.

# C: Glory to You, O Lord. (sung)

1 Jesus left that part of the country and returned with his disciples to Nazareth, his hometown. <sup>2</sup>The next Sabbath he began teaching in the synagogue, and many who heard him were amazed. They asked, "Where did he get all this wisdom and the power to perform such miracles?" 3 Then they scoffed, "He's just a carpenter, the son of Mary and the brother of James, Joseph, Judas, and Simon. And his sisters live right here among us." They were deeply offended and refused to believe in him. <sup>4</sup>Then Jesus told them, "A prophet is honored everywhere except in his own hometown and among his relatives and his own family." 5 And because of their unbelief, he couldn't do any miracles among them except to place his hands on a few sick people and heal them. <sup>6</sup> And he was amazed at their unbelief. Then Jesus went from village to village, teaching the people. 7 And he called his twelve disciples together and began sending them out two by two, giving them authority to cast out evil spirits. 8 He told them to take nothing for their journey except a walking stick—no food, no traveler's bag, no money. 9 He allowed them to

wear sandals but not to take a change of clothes. <sup>10</sup> "Wherever you go," he said, "stay in the same house until you leave town. <sup>11</sup> But if any place refuses to welcome you or listen to you, shake its dust from your feet as you leave to show that you have abandoned those people to their fate." <sup>12</sup> So the disciples went out, telling everyone they met to repent of their sins and turn to God. <sup>13</sup> And they cast out many demons and healed many sick people, anointing them with olive oil. (NLT)
